
NOTICE

In accordance with the directions laid down in Clause No. 4.2.3 of the UGC Guidelines for *Re-opening the Universities and Colleges Post Lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic* dated 5th November 2020, **Tripura University Research Scholars Hostels** (Gents and Ladies) are hereby reopened phase wise as per the approval of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, TU. Scholars as mentioned in Point No:4 are hereby instructed to apply to the Deputy Registrar (i/c), (Academic) within 16th January 2021. However, any scholar permitted entry into Hostel has to strictly comply with the following SOPs.

1. Symptomatic students shall not be allowed under any circumstances.
2. Students seeking entry into R.S. Hostels need to produce COVID-19 test negative (RT PCR) Report. Rapid Antigen Test Report for COVID will not be accepted.
3. Research scholars to be permitted in 2 phases with a maximum of 25 students in each batch per R.S Hostel. Such students need to undergo a 14 days period of compulsory self-isolation within their rooms and self-monitor their health status.
4. Prioritising of permission shall be on the basis of the following:
 - i) Scholars whose Ph.D submission is due in 6months.
 - ii) Those who are working in sponsored projects.
 - iii) Others
5. During self-isolation, students shall clean their rooms by themselves.
6. Thermal screening before entry in each Hostel shall be carried out.
7. Scholars should compulsorily use Face masks and sanitiser of their own.
8. There should be no crowding in hostel areas where students live in close proximity and share common facilities and utilities. Hence, their numbers need to be limited appropriately to avoid crowding. Also, hostel students should be called in phases.
9. Thermal Screening of all resident students should be ensured.
10. They will be referred to the nearest COVID treatment facility for clinical assessment and treatment.
11. Density in dining halls, common rooms, playing areas should be limited, keeping in view the requirement of physical distancing.

12. Hygiene conditions should be regularly monitored in kitchens, dining halls, bathrooms and toilets etc.
13. Cleanliness is to be maintained in dining areas. Meals should be served in small batches, avoiding over-crowding. Take away options should be available for students and staff.
14. It must be ensured that the meals are freshly cooked. A senior staff should monitor the same.
15. Utensils should be properly cleaned.
16. Wearing of face cover/ masks and proper sanitization of hands of the staff engaged for the preparation and distribution of meals should be ensured.
17. Resident students and staff should avoid or limit visiting the markets.
18. Hostels wardens may define the number of students in dining halls at any point in time. Mess timings may be increased to avoid overcrowding.
19. Any symptomatic student should be sent to the TU Health Centre for further check-up.
