The activities of the institution in the above five sections or in other relevant areas are being surveyed to create a quality profile for the year in relation to institutional vision and goals. The survey results would enable the institution and IQAC to create a quality index profile, which would be a self learning exercise. Apart from the responses to the online survey, all the evidence are to be sent to NAAC to audit and to create an output profile of the institution in relation to NAAC core values on higher education. This would enable NAAC to make a diagnostic survey of national higher education scenario and the feedback will be provided to each participating institution.

No judgement or categorization on institutional quality is intended. However, incremental growth profile of the institution for every year will be consolidated and the accreditation / reaccreditation process SSR/RAR will be prepared based on the survey response pattern by the concerned institution.

As an outcome of previous activity, the scholars are getting the scope of using costly equipments like HPLC, CGMS, GCMS, Fluorescent Microscope, UV-VIS Spectrophotometer, PCR, Atomic Force Microscope (AFM), GPS receiver for ionospheric study, FT-IR spectrometer. So research scholars are now strong enough to perform a good number of experimental research in the home university without begging data from other institutions.
