The survey results would enable the institution and IQAC to create a quality index profile, which would be a self learning exercise. Apart from the responses to the online survey, all the evidence are to be sent to NAAC to audit and to create an output profile of the institution in relation to NAAC core values on higher education. This would enable NAAC to make a diagnostic survey of national higher education scenario and the feedback will be provided to each participating institution.

No judgement or categorization on institutional quality is intended. However, incremental growth profile of the institution for every year will be consolidated and the accreditation / reaccreditation process SSR/RAR will be prepared based on the survey response pattern by the concerned institution.
