#### **ABOUT THE SEMINAR:**

Trade is an important instrument for growth and development process of an economy and in fact, regarded as an engine of growth. Trade in many instances, helped to reduce poverty as well. Trade has helped economies to improve its growth and at the same time, economic integration with different countries has helped countries to propel its existing growth pattern. India (northeaster region) shares border with five Asian countries and have blood, cultural, ethnic and trade relationships among themselves. However, this north eastern region of India has always remained involved in border and insurgency problems with these neighbouring countries. Interestingly, every state of the NER of India share international border with one or more of the Asian countries and consequently, signed agreements to trade with these countries through land custom stations.. Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim are the only two states of the north eastern region of India which share international border with three countries. On the one hand, Arunachal Pradesh shares longest 1817 km of international border with Bhutan, Myanmar and highest being with China while Sikkim shares only 350.15 km with Bhutan, China and Nepal. Assam shares 530 km with Bangladesh and Bhutan while Mizoram 828 km with Bangladesh and Myanmar. However, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Tripura share 398 km, 443 km, 215 km and 856 km respectively with a single country. Thus, each and every state of the region shares international with one or more of the Asian countries. Thus cooperation and integration of the northeastern states of India with Asian and or Southeast Asia would boost the growth and development process of the region.

#### SUB-THEMES OF THE SEMINAR:

- to explore the development of the specific state of the Northeast India with the help of neighboring countries,
- to examine the challenges faced by the specific states of the region in forging ties with the border-sharing countries,
- to examine the trade pattern (both formal and informal) between the specific state and the border-sharing countries,
- to explore the potential areas for the specific state of Northeast India to capture the opportunities under the sub-regional cooperation and integration framework,
- to examine the impact of sub-regional cooperation of the specific state and the border-sharing countries on the state income and employment,
- to examine the role of the institution in developing the subregional between the state and its neighboring countries.
